1. Purpose

To facilitate the PAANDA Committee in selecting semesterly productions, and relevant production roles.

2. Proposing a Production

- 2.1 Productions may be proposed by any PAANDA member.
- 2.2 Productions must be proposed using the Production Proposal Form.
 - 2.2.1 Proposals may be submitted with or without production role allocation.

3. Proposing Production Roles

- 3.1 Eligibility for production roles is outlined in the Terms of Reference.
- 3.2 Production roles may be proposed in the Production Proposal Form.
- 3.3 The success of the production proposal does not necessitate or entail the success of proposed production roles.

4. Debating Proposals

- 4.1 Proposers are given no more than 2 minutes to pitch their proposal, this does not include question time.
- 4.2 The PAANDA Committee may then ask the proposer questions pertaining to their proposal.
- 4.3 Once all questions have been exhausted, the committee must now debate the production roles for the proposed production.
 - 4.3.1 At this stage all PAANDA Committee members must be invited to nominate themselves for a production role.
- 4.4 Before voting begins, all potential Directors must be partnered with at least 1 potential Stage Manager for the proposed production(s).

5. Ballots

- 5.1 After all proposals have been debated and all nominees have been considered, the Secretary shall prepare the voting ballots.
- 5.2 The option(s) on the ballot shall contain all combinations of Production, Director, and Stage Manager.

6. Voting

- 6.1 Voting is compulsory and anonymous.
- 6.2 Voting is mandatory preferential.
- 6.3 Ballots shall be collected and counted by the Secretary.
 - 6.3.1 In the instance that the Secretary has a conflict of interest, the PAANDA Committee will appoint an alternative person.
- 6.4 The results shall be determined by absolute majority.
